# A. Saturday Morning: PRIVATE TOUR OF STANFORD LINEAR ACCELERATOR LABORATORY

Located on the western edge of the Stanford campus, SLAC National Accelerator Laboratory (formerly Stanford Linear Accelerator Center) is a Department of Energy national laboratory that is home to the world's longest linear particle accelerator (2 miles long), one of the first synchrotron (soft x-ray) sources and the world's most intense free-electron x-ray laser — all of which are now used by scientists worldwide to discover and characterize new materials, medicines and phenomena. Six Nobel Prizes in physics and chemistry have been awarded to scientists whose research was conducted at SLAC.

On our tour, we will visit the "klystron gallery" that powers the accelerator, the master control room (the accelerator will be running while we're there) and have a driving tour through the 426-acre SLAC site in the scenic foothills of the Santa Cruz Mountains.

These two hotels are right next to each other and share a parking lot. They are also very well-located for the baseball games (a pleasant walk or extremely short drive to Sunken Diamond); for the train to San Francisco (the station is behind the hotels); and for the restaurants of downtown Palo Alto (a few blocks past the train station).

The Westin is somewhat nicer but also somewhat costlier than the Sheraton.

#### **B. TRAFFIC TIP**

To get to the Stanford campus or the Westin/Sheraton hotels from the US 101 freeway, take the Embarcadero exit rather than University Ave. Embarcadero is one exit south of University.

- University Ave has a good deal of traffic and stoplights, and the key intersection at University and El Camino can be congested and confusing.
- In contrast, Embarcadero has much less traffic; it gives you an easy right turn onto El Camino for the hotels; and it also runs straight into Galvez St, the campus road that leads to Sunken Diamond and the Visitors Center.
